a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The goal is to improve and replace residential campus structures so that critical services can continue to be provided in a structurally safe, code-compliant, and welcoming environment. With the rise of illicit drug use in Duval County, River Region Human Services (RRHS) believes that with treatment and supportive services, we can help those individuals struggling with addiction and provide them treatment in a safe, suitable, and supportive environment.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The objectives are:

- 1)Improve energy efficiency with safety and compliance of facilities through upgraded fixtures.
- 2) Improve the quality of life for residents through renovations.
- 3) Ensure durability and continuing availability of current and future residents to achieve sobriety while in treatment or transitional housing.
- c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Residential substance abuse treatment and supportive housing services for individuals 18 and older seeking treatment for opioid and other substance use, and co-occurring substance use and mental health disorders, support for HIV and AIDS, and supportive housing to address chronic homelessness. Case management services to assist clients becoming self-sufficient and independent.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population served by this project are persons with poor mental health, economically disadvantaged persons, homeless, drug users, and drug offenders. We expect to serve between 401-800 persons.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected benefits/outcomes of this project are to improve mental health, enhance specific individuals economic self sufficiency, reduce recidivism and reduce substance abuse. The methodology which these outcomes will be measure by, are the scores from the SRQ-20 assessment to be lowered at each given assessment of 3, 6, and 12 month intervals; by the number of individuals that successfully gain employment and obtain permanent housing; measure by the number of individuals that re-enter treatment during a 12-month period; and treatment progress by observed monthly drug screens and the confirmation results and treatment progress as determined by prognosis scale (good.fair.poor).

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?
